



In the 2015/16 academic year, in Poland there are:

- 418 institutions of higher education with 103,795 academics
 - 1,405,133 students, including 57,119 foreigners (4.1%) from 157 countries ten years ago it was only 0.5%
 from 2015/06 (Poland's accession to the EU) it is almost sixfold increase from 10,092 to 57,119 students; a 23% increase from 2014/15



Studying in Kraków

Kraków is a major academic and research centre in Poland, its academic traditions going back to the 14th c. As the former capital of Poland and currently her second biggest city, situated in southern Poland in the vicinity of the Tatra Mountains, it is a great place to study. With its 23 higher education institutions and nearly 100 research institutes, Kraków attracts numerous students and scientists. It is also home to various companies, institutions and museums. The city's historic centre, chosen for the rst UNESCO World Heritage List in 1978, welcomes ca. 10 million tourists a year. Since the last decade Kraków has become one of the most appreciated tourist destinations in Europe. Getting around is easy using the extensive public transport or exploring the city by bike. Kraków is well connected for travel within Europe and has excellent links to the rest of the world.





Jagiellonian University greenery



The Jagiellonian University area includes the following greenery:

Botanical Garden – managed by the Institute of Botany, functions as a didactic-research base, available for visitors. It is the oldest botanical garden in Poland, founded in 1783. Its area is ca. 10 ha, and its collection embraces ca. 5,000 species and forms of plants. The main part of the garden is the arboretum (a collection of trees). The other parts include: useful plants, medicinal plants, ornamental plants, protected and endangered plants; highland plants in the alpinarium, and tropical plants in the greenhouses;

Professor's Garden with the area of 0.15 ha – the oldest JU greenery dated to 1467; at first it was a garden with useful plants and vegetables, and an orchard; in the 19th century, it was transformed into a garden for the needs of the Department of Botany; revitalized in 2010;



Greenery at buildings – greenery in outdoor spaces at the JU didactic and administrative buildings plays a very important compositional, landscape and climatic function for the facilities and their users.

Greenery of III Campus – area of ca. 55 ha, including two public parks (4 ha and 2 ha) with outdoor gyms; greeneries at the facilities - 8 ha, as well as meadows and wooded land - 41 ha. The greeneries on the Campus have been arranged since 2009: in several years 2,000 trees and ca. 15,000 bushes of over 900 species and decorative forms have been planted;





Private housing

•The cost offer for private housing ranges between 400 and 1,500 PLN, depending on whether you are sharing a room/flat, and with how many people, how far from the centre, etc.

•There are different housing agencies where students can search for private accommodation: i.e. "Bratniak" Foundation Agency of Housing and Work <u>www.biuro.bratniak.krakow.pl</u> or Bratnia Pomoc Akademicka (ul. Św. Anny) or other estate agencies. <u>Erasmus Student</u> <u>Network</u>, a student organisation at the Jagiellonian University, helps international student with finding a flat or room.

- •Cup of coffee 6-10 PLN (≈ 1.8-2.5 EUR)
- •Meal/lunch in a canteen 10-20 PLN (≈2.5-5 EUR)
- •Meal in a restaurant 40-...PLN (≈ 10 EUR)
- •1 kg of apples 3 PLN (≈ 0.70 EUR)
- •100 g of meat 3 PLN (≈ 0.70 EUR)
- •100 g of cheese 5 PLN (≈ 1.10 EUR)
