About TNUA



In 1979, the Executive Yuan, unveiling a plan to promote cultural and recreational activities, decided to set up a higher education institution dedicated to nurturing talents for fine arts, performing arts and academic research. Therefore, the school had to be founded on the "highest standards". The government at the time invested multiple resources and assembled a team of elite in order to provide new momentum for the development of the nation's arts and related human resources. On October 22, a preparatory committee was formed by leading figures from the arts and educational sectors, and on July 1, 1982 the National Institute of the Arts was born.

The school was founded with three departments: Music, Fine Arts and Theatre Arts. Classes were taught in rooms borrowed from the Taipei International Youth Center. In 1983, the school added the Department of Dance. In April 1985, classes were moved to facilities borrowed from the National Overseas Chinese Student University Preparatory School at Luchou, Taipei County. In September 1990, construction work on the Kuandu campus was completed. In late July 1991, the school was formally relocated to Kuandu. The school's entire staff and students took part in a ritualistic parade to the new campus, marking a brand new stage of the school's development.

In order to provide a platform for integrating various academic achievements, the Center for Traditional Arts was established in 1982. In 1992, the Center for Art and Technology was set up to become a champion of cross-disciplinary integration between art and technology. In 1993, the school founded the Performance Arts Center, becoming the only higher

education institute in Taiwan to own a professional concert hall, dance theater and experimental theater. It was renamed as the Performing Art Center in 1994. On August 1, 2001 the school was officially renamed as Taipei National University of the Arts (TNUA) with five schools: Music, Fine Arts, Theatre Arts, Dance, and Culture and Resources.

In addition, in order to enhance its academic performance and expand its international presence, TNUA turned its research and development center into the Office of Research and Development and created the International Exchange Center on August 1, 2006. And to promote arts education into the community, the Center for Continuing Education Center was reformed into the Center for Arts Resources and Continuing Educational Outreach in 2008. In the same year, the Arts and Activity Complex was unveiled, with its movie theater formally opened in October.

To further shape TNUA into a comprehensive arts university, the School of Film and New Media was founded in 2009. In 2010, the Department of Filmmaking and the Department of New Media Art were established.

Now TNUA has six schools covering major areas in arts and culture: Music, Fine Arts, Theatre Arts, Dance, Filmmaking and New Media, and Culture Resources. Its comprehensiveness and range of facilities—including a concert hall, dance theater, experimental theater, movie theater and fine arts museum—are rare among the world's universities. It is an ideal training ground for arts talents through a pedagogy that places equal emphases on the academic and practical sides.

Visa and Alien Resident Certificate (ARC)

A. Visa

BEFORE coming to Taiwan, you need to apply for Visitor or Residence Visa at the local Taiwan Embassy or Representative Office. Visitor Visa is a short-term visa for foreign applicants who plan to stay in Taiwan less than 180 days. Resident Visa is a long-term visa for foreign applicants who plan to stay in Taiwan over 180 days.

In other words, exchange students who are on one semester program should apply for Visitor Visa. For those who plan to stay for two semesters should apply for Residence Visa. Resident Visa holders should change to Alien Resident Certificate within 2 weeks after arrival. (See the section below)

It is strongly advised to apply for multiple-entry Visitor Visa if you plan to travel to other countries during your stay. Please contact the Taiwan Embassy or Representative Office for the latest information (http://www.taiwanembassy.org)

B. Alien Resident Certificate (ARC)

Resident Visa holders are required to apply for Alien Resident Visa (ARC) and Re-entry Permit at local service of Ministry of Interior National Immigration Agency within 15 days upon your arrival. ARC will be regarded as your temporary ID card and valid during your exchange program in Taiwan.

- [5] Fee: NT\$1,000

Health Exam and **Insurance Requirements**

Health Exam

To meet the regulations of TNUA and the requirements of Taiwan government, all exchange students must take a health exam by a qualified hospital 2 months before coming to Taiwan.

You should send the scanned file of the Heath Exam certificate to IEC officer 2 weeks before your arrival; the original copy is also required to submit on the day of registration.

Short-term Mandatory Medial Insurance

Exchange students are required to purchase adequate medical and accident insurance covering the entire period of the exchange program from your home country. The proof of your medical and accident insurance is regarded as one of requirement for completing the registration procedure.

Mobile Phone

For exchange students who stay only one or two semesters in Taiwan, it is recommended to purchase a prepaid phone card to use your mobile. You can find prepaid phone cards at any local phone retailer or some convenient store (such as 7-11). Prepaid cards generally come in NT \$300 or \$500 increments. When purchasing a prepaid card, you'll need to show two forms of ID, for example, passport, visa, driving license or ARC.

Settlement

To recharge your prepaid card, go to any convenience store (7-11, Family Mart, OK Mart) and purchase a recharge card. Then, dial the three digit service number displayed on the card and follow the voice prompts in English.



Studying at TNUA

♦ Registration

Studying at TNUA

There are some documents you need to send the soft copies to IEC by E-mail 2 weeks before your arrival.

- Medical and Accident Insurance Proof
- The Heath Exam Form (Proof of Positive Measles and Rubella Antibody Titers or Measles and Rubella Immunization Certificates)
- Authorization for Emergency Situations (provided by IEC)

Exchange students should plan to arrive in TNUA one week before the semester starts (Mid-September for fall semester, Late-February for spring semester) to complete registration procedure. You will need to bring your passport and come to the IEC office to pick up the registration form upon during the office hour.

You also need to prepare 22,500 NTD for the dormitory fee and NTD 3,000 for deposit. According to the new regulations, exchange students need to fulfill the exam for Chest X-Ray for Tuberculosis after arrival. This exam would be part of your registration procedure, the fee is about 300-500 NTD.

♦ Course Selection

Most of the courses are taught in Chinese, but some professors can provide assistance in English if it is needed. Exchange students who do not have sufficient knowledge of Chinese should consult with the professor before enrolling in the course.

An exchange student should take at least 9 credits every semester; or the credits requirement should be based on the agreement between TNUA and the home institution.

The deadline for course selection is about 2 weeks after the

semester starts. Exchange students are advised to audit the classes that you are interested in and complete the course registration in the second week of the semester.

♦ Deregistration

When it comes to the last semester of exchange program, it is important to inform the IEC officer at the beginning of the semester about your departure date. Exchange students should complete the deregistration procedures before leaving TNUA.

Students should come to the IEC office to pick up the form and follow the instructions to the get approvals from the relevant units.

Performance and Exhibition Facilities

Concert Hall

It is designed for classical music, with state-of-the-art facilities. It houses a handmade pipe organ by Karl Schuke offering internationally accepted quality of sounds that can delight each and every one in the audience. Capacity: 500



Experimental Theatre

It is a multi-style theatre that can be adjusted to offer a proscenium stage, an open stage, or a center stage, catering to different styles of production in relation to the audiences. Capacity: 362 seats



Dance Theatre

A proscenium stage specifically for dance performances, the Dance Theatre features wooden floorings carefully designed for the safety of dancers. The special side lights of the stage are designed for professional dance performances. Capacity: 344 seats



Movie Theatre

Inside the Arts and Activity Complex that stands on the Egret Grassland, there is a 200-seat movie theatre with Dolby sound systems for screening 35mm films. It is meant for students and teachers to showcase and enjoy films of their own and others.



Kuandu Museum of Fine Arts

As the first-ever on-campus museum in Taiwan, the Kuandu Museum of Fine Arts houses nine exhibition rooms. Floor space, both indoor and outdoor, totals 25,920 square feet to serve multiple purposes: showing creative artworks, practicing critical reviews, organizing exhibitions, promoting education and housing arts collections.

- The Red 35 & 55 schedule above is for reference. The cost and discount services are as the standard of Taipei city buses.

♦ Dormitory

TNUA Student Dormitory Management Regulations J

Article 1. There are 4 dorms at TNUA. One with the door card or permission, which should register in day time, can be allowed to enter. Visit to Female dorms is not permitted from 00:20 to 5:30. If one would enter the dorm after 23:00, with particular reasons, should exchange valid certificate for a spare card from the dormitory guard.

Article 2. TNUA Dormitory only provides beds, chairs, closets, and lamps. Other furniture or private materials are not included.

Articles 3. Other regulations are listed below:

- (1) One has to follow the dormitory regulations for sustaining environmental quality and security.
- (2) Improperly usage to cause damages on public property should be fined.
- (3) Private stuffs should not be settled in public place.
- (4) Lost student ID card or door card should be reported as soon as possible.
- (5) Any public property cannot be borrowed without official permission.
- (6) Do not hang clothes outside rooms.
- (7) Do not park inside the dorms.
- (8) Do not keep pets.
- (9) Do not exchange rooms without official permission.
- (10) Do not bring outsiders into dorms.
- (11) Any public facility should stay the original color.
- (12) Do not cook or use high power-consuming electronic equipments.
- (13) Any alcohol trouble, brawling, gambling, stealing, and etc. would be punished through the TNUA disciplines.

(14) Any prohibited area cannot be entered without official permission.

Article 4. One should check all properties inside the room before moves in. Any damage or problem should be reported to the dormitory guard as soon as possible. Moreover, students should make sure objects' ownership to avoid quarrels at the end of semesters.

Article 5. Dormitory living supports as below:

[Dining] TNUA Cafeteria offers breakfast, lunch, and supper. One also can use refrigerator, microwave ovens, and etc. in public kitchens. Yet, cooking inside rooms is not allowed.

[Laundry] 20 NTD for washing machine each time; 10 NTD for clothes dryer (40 minutes for each time). Do not hang clothes higher than balconies.

- (1) Each room in the coed dormitory and second female dormitory has electricity meter. The basic electricity power provided is 450 degree each month. One should pay 3.5 NTD for each extra degree at the end of each semester. One who lives in the first female dormitory and wants to use air conditioner should buy a card (3.5 NTD for each degree).
- (2) If one needs to call TNUA dormitory, please dial 2896-1000: plus "8" before the room number in the coed dorm (8+ room number); plus "7" before the room number in the second female dorm. As for first female dorm, please see following:

- (5) Do not paste posters, hooks, and etc. on walls.




